DSA members and locals are encouraged to explore Solidarity Economics, a broad area of inquiry into diverse forms of economic activity aimed at sustainable and ethical outcomes as well as monetary ones in the production of goods and services. Solidarity Economics typically examines activities such as cooperatives and worker self-managed enterprises that can be started even under capitalism but that include elements of a better economic order.
